### Cadets “Crush” Crusaders

Wow!!! What can I say? For those of you who came out to support our St. Joseph's Cadets, you witnessed a complete dismantling of the #1 seeded team, the Holy Cross Crusaders.

In front of a sold out crowd at Municipal Stadium in Waterbury, and playing in the CIAC Class SS semi-final game, these Cadets were simply unstoppable. Joseph Della Vecchia only needed to throw 12 passes recording 165 yards, 4 went for touchdowns. SJ wide receiver Patrick Mulligan caught 4 passes for 64 yards with 2 for scores. While Tyler Matakovich rushed for 132 yards (2 TDs) and added 44 more receiving (1 TD). The Hogs “D” crucified the poor Crusaders, as the Cadets “O” scored at will, leaving Holy Cross praying for answers.

What a perfect evening for football where thousands gathered to watch one team's season end, while the victor continued on to the Championship game. Gossip filled the air of talk where one team "blogged" about the other being over-rated, specifically naming one player. This individual raised the game to a completely different level. He didn't need to prove himself to anyone, but the fire that burned inside of him was one like no other. A personal vendetta as he wore "Over-Rated" written on his person. This individual was one to be reckoned with leaving it all on the field. His name you ask? No need. The game wasn't about him, for he plays for a Team that truly is... extraordinary.

The Hogs took the field to start the game as energy and excitement filled the air. Holy Cross had no idea what was in store for them. Junior linebacker Sean Chinova led the way having 10 tackles on the night. On the Crusaders first offensive series, the SJ "D" shut them down. Tri-Captain's Russ Renfer and Tony Civitella each had 2 tackles. Now it was the Cadets turn to show what an explosive offense can really do. On their first play, Tyler Matakevich pummeled over the Holy Cross defenders for a 30 yard gain. SJ-QB Joseph Della Vecchia on his first pass hit Patrick Mulligan deep down the right side of the field for YES... a 42 yard touchdown! The visiting fans roared as the echoes filled the stadium. On trotted senior kicker Casey Olayos, who kicked the extra point. Cadets 7 \* Crusaders 0

1<sup>st</sup> quarter and round 2 as Holy Cross took the field again. Strong safety Kevin Nichols and middle linebacker Matakevich each had 2 tackles plugging up the run game. Within minutes the poor Crusaders were punting the ball away. Mulligan returned the ball 26 yards giving St. Joseph's excellent field position on the home team's 14 yard line. Matakevich did his thing! His first carry went for 13 yards and his second found the end zone. The Cadets were gaining momentum and there was nothing Holy Cross could do to stop them. Olayos kicked the extra point. Cadets 14 \* Crusaders 0

SJ tri-captain, Nick Pulaski recorded his third consecutive special teams tackle after each of the kick-offs. The man was simply relentless. The Hog's Chinova had 2 pounding tackles in the series and once again, Holy Cross found themselves punting the ball away. The St. Joseph's "O" took the field and made quick work of the Crusaders defense. Della Vecchia hit wide receiver Jerry Kramer for a 9 yard completion. Does anyone believe in "D\_j\_Vu?" Matakevich, much like his first carry of the game rumbled for a 29 yard gain. What came next? Della Vecchia completed a 42 yard bomb, but this time it was to wide receiver Jason Mawicke for another score. Too easy! Olayos kicked the extra point. Cadets 21 \* Crusaders 0

As the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter was winding down, the Hogs were still fired up. Tom Walczyk and Civitella each had 2 tackles before the clock expired. The 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter began with 3 straight incomplete passes by the Crusaders. They could not find a weakness in this SJ defense. The Cadets didn't take long before scoring again. Della Vecchia connected with Matakevich on 2 consecutive passes (5, 27) which helped set up another Tyler touchdown. He rushed up the middle for a 13 yard score. Matakevich was unstoppable. Olayos kicked the extra point. Cadets 28 \* Crusaders 0

Holy Cross, the Class SS #1 seed were dumbfounded as the coaches, the players, and their fans were all in complete disarray. Kevin Belgrade, the senior SJ defensive linemen came barreling in on the Crusaders quarterback's blind-side, sacking him and causing him to fumble. The Hogs Tim Izzo was right there to recover the ball. St. Joe's bench was jumping for joy! The Cadets work horse of an offensive line gave Joe, the wide receivers and running backs all the time in the world to have their way with Holy Cross. This "O" line (Ryan Taylor, Nick Pulaski, Nick Francis, Mike Marini and Nick Adzima) were having their way all night with the Crusaders front four, winning the battle in the trenches. Matakevich had another carry for 11 more yards, while Della Vecchia connected with Mulligan for their second time, hitting him on a 9 yard score. Olayos kicked the extra point. Cadets 35 \* Crusaders 0

The Crusaders found themselves in familiar waters again ready to punt the ball, when SJ senior Nick Prutting came charging in to block the punt. Perfectly timed! Perfectly executed! St. Joseph's were now sitting on the Holy Cross 12 yard line. Like clock work, Matakevich had a 5 yard run, while on the next play Della Vecchia hit Tyler for a touchdown pass. Olayos kicked the extra point. The Hogs on "D" closed the quarter.

At the start of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Coach Della Vecchia needed to make sure his Cadets stayed within the 50 point margin. St. Joseph's needed to slow the game down a little bit and... "Take the pedal off the metal." Kramer returned the kick-off 26 yards. Joe Burns, the sophomore running back carried the ball twice for 13 yards which helped set up an attempted 38 yard field goal by Casey. The ball missed wide right, but the drive ate up most of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter. After a shared Hogs sack by Izzo and Walczyk, it seemed the Crusaders were never going to find the end zone. But, on the very next play their QB hit his open wide receiver for a 73 yard score. The home team cheered and rightfully so... Cadets 42 \* Crusaders 7

The SJ starting "O" put one last drive together. Matakevich had 4 straight carries racking up 30 yards, while Della Vecchia completed a pass to Kramer for 9 more. Burns and Civitella did the rest. Burns' next 2 runs totaled 20 yards, while captain Civitella rushed 3 consecutive times. On his third carry which was the first play of the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter, Tony scored on a 2 yard touchdown run. The Cadet's fans were ecstatic as were the coaches and players. Olayos kicked the extra point. Cadets 49 \* Crusaders 7

The game was in its final minutes. Most of the senior classmen took over on "D". Shane O'Brien had a big sack, with tackles made by Justin Brantley, Erik Cranston and Pat Magee. The celebration began after senior defensemen George Alexander Nation III picked up a Crusaders fumble and raced 42 yards for a touchdown. The game ended on a fumble recovery by our junior middle linebacker Will Dwinells. To be continued...

## St. Joseph thumps Holy Cross, advances to final

WATERBURY -- The Holy Cross Crusaders rode their defense to a 9-1 record and their league championship this season, but it was quickly evident that they never faced an offense the caliber of St. Joseph in the NVL.

Scoring early and often, the Cadets made their reappearance in the CIAC football playoffs a successful one with an overwhelming 56-7 rout of the Crusaders Tuesday night in a Class SS semifinal game at Municipal Stadium.

Quarterback Joe Della Vecchia was a near-perfect 9 of 11 for 165 yards and four touchdowns, including a 42-yard scoring bomb to Pat Mulligan on his first attempt of the game.

The Cadets got the ball for the first time at their own 28 after a Holy Cross punt and quickly established their dominance. Classy running back Tyler Matakevich took a handoff and rambled 30 yards on St. Joseph's first play from scrimmage and before the Crusaders could catch their breath Della Vecchia was hooking up with the streaking Mulligan for the game's first score.

"There was a couple of things I thought we could do, and my son and I talked about going deep on one of the first couple of plays to see if they could keep up with Mulligan," St. Joseph coach Joe Della Vecchia said. "So we took a shot early and they couldn't (stay with him)."

Holy Cross went three-and-out after the touchdown and Mulligan fielded a short punt in stride in Crusaders territory and returned it 27 yards to the 13. Two Matakevich runs later it was 14-0 Cadets.

After the next Holy Cross drive fizzled out, a booming punt forced the Cadets back to their own 19, from where it would take them all of three plays to score. A 9-yard swing pass from Della Vecchia to Jerry Kramer, another 30-yard jaunt by Matakevich and a 42-yard scoring strike from Della Vecchia to Jason Mawicke boosted the lead to 21-0 for an offense that was clearly hitting on all cylinders.

"We know how good our offense is," Matakevich said. "But we're starting to gel really nice with the Trumbull game (49-31 Thanksgiving win) and now here tonight. Everyone's starting to come together at the right time."

The Cadets would pile on with 21 more points in the second quarter. Matakevich capped the Cadets' first drive of the second quarter by blasting his way into the end zone from 13 yards out against a defense that looked uninterested in tackling him.

A Kevin Belgrade sack and forced fumble set up another Della Vecchia-to-Mulligan touchdown and a blocked punt by Nick Prutting led to the final score of the opening half, a 12-yard toss from Della Vecchia to Matakevich, who neatly kept his feet in bounds at the back of the end zone.

As great as the offense played in the first half, the St. Joseph defense (65 points allowed in its final two games), subjected to much ridicule in the blogosphere, was playing its best game of the season, allowing only four first downs and 26 yards of total offense in the first half.

"We saw the blogs and everything and we just used it to pump us up," Matakevich said. "We took it a little personally and tonight we proved we could play good defense and stop the run."

The Cadets lost their shutout on a 73-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Plourde to Matt Czapor midway through the third quarter, but Della Vecchia was able to rest his starters and begin thinking about Montville and the Class SS final this weekend.

"We saw them once and it should be a great game," Della Vecchia said. "We've had to get ready really fast for our last couple of games and we just have to do it one more time."
