• Email Address/LinkedIn

- Students should create a professional email address for college admissions correspondence
- Example: john_roberts@aol.com
- Ownership and Responsibility
 - Students should complete their own:
 - Applications
 - Essays
 - Resumes
 - Portfolios





HOW PARENTS CAN HELP

- Complete the *Questionnaire for Parents* and submit to your child's guidance counselor.
- Utilize Family Connection on Naviance website
 - <u>www.connection.naviance.com/sjhs</u>
 - Conduct college/career searches with student
- Organize materials
 - College mailings
 - SAT/ACT test registration
 - Test preparation
 - Etc.
- Arrange college visits
- Meet with your child and their counselor



College Search/Application Process Student-driven with help from parents

- Where do I begin? As a family consider:
 - Location, size
 - Cost
 - Public vs. Private
 - Program of study

- Meet with your counselor often

Admissions Standards

- What do colleges consider?
 - GPA and grade trend
 - Standardized test scores
 - Strength of curriculum
 - Extracurricular involvement
 - Essay

- Recommendation letters (ask in advance)
- Interview (if offered)

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION FROM ST JOSEPH HIGH SCHOOL

- Religion 4 credits (1 credit each year)
- English 4 credits (1 credit each year)
- Science 3 credits
- Mathematics 4 credits
- Social Studies 3.5 credits (this includes 1.5 credits in American History and .50 credit in Civics).
- World Language 2 credits of same language
- Phys. Ed./Health 1 credit (1/2 credit each of the first two years)
- Electives 4.5 credits
- One credit earned from the following during the first two years:
- Computer 610 .50 credit
- Art I, Music I, or Theater I .50 Credit
- [or] Band or Chorus .50 credit
- Total Credits: 26

* Transfer student credit requirements will be determined on a case-by-case basis.

What classes should I take senior year?

- Most Rigorous Course of Study *appropriate for you* in addition to required English, Civics, Math and Religion courses:
 - 4th year of Science
 - 3rd or 4th year of World Language
 - Electives
 - Check with your counselor /college admission counselors on requirements for specific majors
 - Check with your counselor to make sure your courses are NCAA approved if you are a student athlete
- Why?
 - High school is practice for college success
 - Admission criteria includes strength of curriculum

• Up to 9 schools on final list


- Possible/Reach

Admission standards

- Use GPA, test scores, required courses to determine likelihood of admission
- Use graph and statistical information on Naviance

College Visits

- Plan to visit now, spring & summer
- Ideally when students are on campus
- Attend open houses
- Set up visits
 - Online
 - By phone
 - Use 1-800 number
- Ask many questions



College Visits

- What should I do on a college visit?
 - Take a tour of campus
 - Attend an information session in the admissions office
 - Sit in on a class
 - Speak with someone in your field of interest
 - Set up an interview (if offered)
 - Stay overnight in a dorm
 - Eat in the cafeteria
 - Visit the surrounding area

Standardized Tests: SAT

- SAT Reasoning Test
 - Tests aptitude
- Mandatory Writing
 - Evidence Based Reading and Writing (800)
 - Math (800)
 - Essay (Optional)



*SAT Subject tests should be taken by students applying to selective schools that require them

Standardized Tests: ACT

• ACT

- Curriculum-based test
- Composite Score (36)
- 4 Sub scores
 - Math
 - Science Reasoning
 - Reading
 - English

- ACT w/ Optional Writing Test
 - Combined English score with essay
 - Essay scored on a 12 point scale


How do I register?

- Online Registration
 - <u>www.actstudent.org</u>
 - www.collegeboard.com/student/testing/sat/about.html
 - Pay with credit card
- High School Code: 070797
- Determine which test is your best performance; repeat that one in senior year
- Do not send scores until senior year
- Most colleges look at your highest combined scores called "superscore" on the SAT, and your highest composite ACT score (some colleges will superscore ACT)



If your student has a special talent...


- Art- then help him/her assemble a portfolio to send to colleges with the application
- Music- consider making a recording to send to colleges



- Writing- encourage him/her to keep a collection of stories or poems to include with the college application
- Athletics- encourage your child to contact college coaches directly requesting information. Consult with your child's coach to determine if your child should create a highlights film for college coaches

NCAA Clearinghouse

- Student Athletes
 - Interested in playing Division I or II sports at college level
- Send ACT/SAT test scores *directly* to the Clearinghouse. Use code: 9999
- Check with your counselor to make sure all courses are NCAA approved
- <u>www.eligibilitycenter.net</u>
- Complete registration online
 \$70 Fee required
- Request transcripts from Guidance Office *using forms printed during registration*
- Attend our NCAA Clearinghouse Presentation on Tuesday., March 13th at 6:30pm



Get a Head Start on Application Components

- Letters of Recommendation from teachers
 - Begin thinking about which teachers you will ask to write for you and make verbal contact
- Build your resume/portfolios
- Plan your essay
- Meet often with your counselor
- Attend the SJHS College fair: March 7th
- Junior College Planning workshops begin January 29th in the Guidance Office
